The Architectural Heritage Center / Bosco-Milligan Foundation inaugurated the Preservation in Action Award as part of the 20th anniversary in 2008. The awards were created with the goal of promoting more preservation of our historic homes and building by spotlighting outstanding examples of what works. The Timberline Lodge Amphitheater restoration was one of the recipients of the award and was acknowledged in the AHC Spring 2009 newsletter. Other award recipients were: Academy Theater Redux, Balch Farmhouse Relocation & Restoration, Freimann Restaurant Building, Historic Kenton Firehouse Preservation, Northwest Bank/Barber Block, Northwest Fence and Wire Works, Porter Glisan Building, and West Coast Woods/Legacy House.

An additional class of awards for larger projects was the Preservation in Action Pinnacle Award. Recipients are: Gerding Theater at the Armory, Multnomah County Central Library, Pioneer Courthouse, Telegram Building, and West Coast Woods/Legacy House.
